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District 31's Response to COVID-19

Surviving the 2020 - 2021 School Year

From the beginning, we knew the 2020 - 2021 school year would be a year like no other for our students, teachers, staff, and parents. We experienced new degrees of fear and helplessness. We had to pioneer a way to make schools safe again, to use technology in ways we were not familiar with, and to be flexible to maneuver the ever changing restrictions and guidelines from various organizations, such as the CCDPH, IDPH, and ISBE. Somehow we came together and made it through this unprecedented year.

Though the year was challenging, there were many wonderful things to highlight. We were able to offer in-person and remote instruction for nearly the entire year. Many different community partnerships were formed that will continue to lead to the sharing of new ideas, resources, and opportunities for our families. We were also able to provide a variety of support to District 31 families including technology support, educational support, and free breakfast and lunch for all students. Most recently, we partnered with Glenbrook Hospital to provide vaccine clinics for the community at both Field and Winkelman schools. This pandemic has made us a stronger, tighter community that District 31 is proud to serve.

Planning for the 2021 - 2022 School Year

The District is currently planning for full, daily in-person programming for all students based on guidelines from the CCDPH and ISBE that advocate that, by following safety guidelines, schools should fully reopen for in-person programming in the fall. Per ISBE guidance, a full return to in-person instruction is expected with limited exceptions for remote instruction for qualified students. 
What's to Come...
